A BILL

To revise Federal flammability standards for motor vehicle child restraint systems.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXCLUSION OF CHILD RESTRAINT SYSTEMS**
4 **FROM CERTAIN REGULATION.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
6 date of enactment of this Act, the National Highway Traf-
7 fic Safety Administration shall revise its regulations estab-
8 lishing flammability standards set out in section 571.302
9 of title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, for any child re-

1 straint system (as defined in section 571.213 of such
2 title). Such revised standard shall measure the smolder ig-
3 nition resistance of such restraint systems rather than the
4 open flame flammability of such systems. In revising such
5 regulations, the Administration shall consider the stand-
6 ard and testing methodologies contained in California
7 Technical Bulletin 117–2013, “Requirements, Test Proce-
8 dure and Apparatus for Testing the Smolder Resistance
9 of Materials Used in Upholstered Furniture”.

10 (b) CONSULT WITH EPA.—In revising such regula-
11 tions, the Administration shall consult the Environmental
12 Protection Agency regarding the health effects and expo-
13 sure risks associated with materials used in such restraint
14 systems and shall consider such health effects and risks
15 in determining an appropriate standard
